

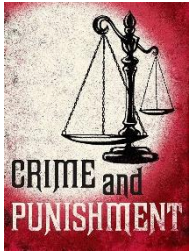

Topic: This half term, our History focus is Crime and Punishment. We will look at how crime has changed over time and the changing attitudes regarding appropriate punishment. We will look at how the concept of what a crime is has changed, as well as key historical figures such as Dick Turpin and the Suffragettes.



PE: Our PE lessons for this half term are on **Mondays and Fridays**. The first Monday back (13th April) we are on our trip to Lunt Fort so children will not have PE that day. However, because we will be doing some physical activities whilst we are there, it is fine if children still want to wear their PE kit that day.



Homework: Homework will be sent out on **Friday** and is due back in no later than the following **Friday** morning. Children will receive:

- 3 Dojos if homework is given in on a Monday
- 2 Dojos if homework is given in on a Tuesday
- 1 Dojo if homework is given in on a Wednesday, Thursday or Friday

Regular reading and a weekly '**soundcheck**' on TTRS is also part of children's homework. Soundchecks are set each Friday and should be completed by the following Friday.



Reading: Diaries will still be checked every Thursday. Children should be reading at home at least 3 times a week.



Multiplication Tables Check: The MTC will take place in the first 2 weeks back after May half term so as much practise over this half term will really help to ensure children's times tables knowledge is secure. A 'little and often' approach is recommended – roughly 10 minutes 3-4 times a week would be great.



Spellings: A paper copy will be sent out for this half term's spellings but we will also stick weekly versions into their diaries when we check them during the week. Spelling tests will take place every Thursday. Children have access to EdShed to help them to learn their weekly spellings (log in details are on the inside cover of diaries).
